Wikipedia Defines Chaplaincy Services: as Ministers, priests, clergy, pastors, Rabbi's, Imams, and even laymen that are available to assist with the spiritual, religious, and emotional needs of the people that they minister to, which often includes family and staff of the organization to which they are called.

ARH Volunteer Healthcare Chaplains

- Presently we have 90 Volunteer Chaplains
- Goal is staff of 12 at each Hospital
- These Chaplains represent several different denominations within the communities which we serve

ARH CHAPLAINS MISSION STATEMENT

 ARH chaplains are available to lead people to experience grace, forgiveness and reconciliation; to offer guidance and support though grief, crises, dying and death; and particularly in end of life decisions; and to enable people to find hope, faith, and love.



• In moments of fear, anxiety, or loneliness; when facing questions of meaning and purpose; and when seeking to experience God in the midst of hospitalization, chaplains are available to assist making hospitalization an experience of spiritual growth.



• ARH Chaplains seek to assist patients to use their personal religious and spiritual beliefs and practices in coping with vital life concerns during hospitalization.

 ARH Chaplains offer religious and spiritual support, conduct religious sacraments and rituals, pray and read scripture.

ARH CHAPLAINCY SERVICES Eligibility Requirements

- Chaplains must be qualified Spiritual Care providers who are ordained, licensed or commissioned by their faith community. Pastors, Deacons, Elders
- Laymen\Faith Group members that have been recommended by their faith community
- ARH employees that are recognized as Spiritual leaders within the workplace, demonstrated compassionate care and skill when ministering to patients



ARH CHAPLAINCY SERVICES PROTOCOLS



ARH CHAPLAINCY SERVICES PROTOCOLS

- ARH Volunteer Chaplains make rounds at each hospital following a set of protocols
- Maintain a professional appearance
- Wear ARH ID Badge
- Identifying themselves upon entering the room
- Following Infection Control rules
- Knocking before entering any room
- Always asking permission
- Trained-concerning the use of touch



ARH CHAPLAINCY SERVICES PROTOCOLS

- Assess the condition and availability of the patient
- Ministering to the patient using the patients personal spiritual resources
- Pray with the Patient and reading scripture
- Listen- listen-
- Closing the meeting with the patient by offering a word of encouragement
- Limiting the length of time in a patients room
- Follow HIPAA guidelines



ARH Chaplains Encourage Staff

- Hospital Staff often deals with Compassion Fatigue or even depression due to loss
- Chaplains ask staff "is there any special way that I can be praying for you"
- Read scripture and pray for staff over the PA System



ARH CHAPLAINCY SERVICES End of Life

- At the time of a patients death, the attending nurse will ask if family has a pastor or a spiritual care provider that they wish to call
- If the patient has no spiritual care provider the nurse will inquire if the family wishes to have the On Call Chaplain to visit with them.
- Chaplains provide spiritual guidance to the dying patient and comfort to the family
